

HIV/AIDS in Chicago

Because HIV-related deaths have declined and diagnoses have remained fairly stable, the number of people living with HIV/AIDS in Chicagoland has steadily increased in the last 10 years. There are now around **25,000** diagnosed cases in the metro area. Of these,

- Two thirds are ages 30-49
- 20% are women
- 60% are African-American
- The top 3 transmission groups are men having sex with men (50%), injection drug use (20%), and heterosexual sex (20%)
- There is at least one case in each of Chicago's 77 neighborhoods

Who We Are

Alexian Brothers AIDS Ministry (ABAM) provides transitional housing and supportive services for people who are diagnosed with HIV/AIDS and are homeless or at risk for homelessness. Founded in 1989 at the height of the AIDS crisis, ABAM has become one of the most established and respected supportive living programs in the Chicago metro area. We provide residents with four walls and three square meals for up to two years. During their time here, they have access to

- Comprehensive Case Management
- Licensed Substance Abuse and Recovery Services
- Occupational Therapy
- Spiritual Care
- After Care

Our vision is to transform the lives of people with HIV/AIDS within a compassionate, supportive community by providing a home, comprehensive services, and spiritual care.

At the end of two years, the majority of our residents rejoin the community as independent, productive members of society. Since its founding, Alexian Brothers AIDS Ministry has served over 1500 residents at its three locations, Bonaventure House on the North Side of Chicago, The Harbor in Waukegan, and Bettendorf Place on the South Side of Chicago (opening 2010).
